The Directors of the Greene County Agricultural Fair, Inc. reserve the right to declare the Fair off and withdraw the premiums offered should unforeseen circumstances occur which would make it advisable to do so. All premiums offered and contracts made are with that distinct understanding. Premium payments are based on availability of funds.

The Fair Directors reserve the final and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations. By entering, the exhibitor agrees to abide by each rule printed in this catalog or obtained from the fair. All entries must have a complete address.

CHECKS MUST BE CASHED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS AFTER THE CLOSE OF THE FAIR OR BE DECLARED NULL AND VOID. No premiums will be paid without social

Every PROTEST made concerning premium(s), class(es), judge(s), rent(s) or admission(s) shall be made in writing, addressed to PROTEST COMMITTEE, P.O. BOX 3, CARROLLTON, IL 62016, setting forth the grounds upon which the PROTEST is based and accompanied by a fee. The PROTEST must be signed by person of legal age. No PROTEST may be made after the class(es) or event(s) have begun.

ALL ANIMALS MUST COMPLY WITH THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICUL-TURE LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS, LIVESTOCK EXHIBITION RULES AND DEPARTMENT RULES PRINTED IN THIS CATALOG.

Each CONCESSIONAIRE must confine himself to the space assigned and must abide by the terms of his CONTRACT. Distribution of handbills or advertising matter, and/or selling, except from the Concessionaire's Space, is prohibited. The posting of advertising on any building or post will NOT BE PERMITTED, unless Advertising Space has been rented.

All livestock and Art Hall entries are confidential. NO ONE to review entries except the person who originally made them until entries are officially closed.

GENERAL POLICE SUPERVISION will be on grounds. All Directors and police are sworn as CONSERVATORS OF THE PEACE, and it shall be their duty to arrest any person(s) creating a disturbance or violating any Rules and Regulations of the Fair or the Laws of the State of Illinois.

There is a minimum age of eight years to be able to show in Livestock shows.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITION RULES

Each exhibitor must purchase an Exhibitor's Ticket at or before the time of making entries. For each twenty dollars (\$20) paid in stall or pen rent, one (1) Helper's Ticket may be purchased (limit two (2) per exhibitor).

DEADLINE FOR ALL LIVESTOCK ENTRIES is Wednesday, June 13, 2018 at 5:00 p.m. at the Secretary's Office. No Refunds or Changes on entries after Wednesday, June 13, 2018. ENTRY BLANKS may be obtained from the SECRETARY'S OFFICE or taken from the last pages in this catalog. Entries may be made by mail to: GREENE COUNTY AGRI-CULTURAL FAIR, INC., P.O. BOX 3, CARROLLTON, IL 62016, or in person at the SECRE-TARY'S OFFICE on the Fairgrounds. The Entry Forms must be accompanied by stall or pen rent and Exhibitor's (and Helper's) Ticket(s) fees. Please state NUMBER and BREED of stock so sufficient stalls or pens may be provided. ENTRY FEE must be paid at the time of entry on

EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE REGISTRATIONS AND HEALTH PAPERS WITH THEM FOR INSPECTION (not required on Steers, Barrows or Sheep, but the animals must be from purebred sires and dams, and not crossbred. This does not preclude the showing of Crossbred Classes). Beef and Swine exhibitors must present HEALTH CERTIFICATES for inspection by the FAIR VETERINARIAN at 8:30 a.m. one day before showing.



All Purebred Classes of Animals listed in our Fair Book shall have Registration Papers and Reg. Numbers for entry forms. Land of Lincoln, 4-H, or FFA identification for market animals may be substituted for Registration Papers and Reg. Numbers.

ENTRIES MAY NOT BE MADE OR ALTERED IN THE SHOW RING.

NO EXHIBITOR MAY ENTER OR SHOW MORE THAN TWO (2) ENTRIES UNDER ANY PREMIUM NUMBER. All entries must be in the name of the owner and the property of the exhibitor more than thirty (30) days prior to the FAIR.

Parties contracting for Stalls or Pens and not occupying them shall forfeit the fees paid, and if any exhibitor has made any false statement with regard to any animal exhibited, or if any exhibitor interferes with the judge in the performance of his duty, he shall be disqualified from further competition and shall lose any premium(s) already awarded and any stall or pen rent paid.

Expert judges will be secured and all awards will be made by the single judging system. No judge shall be permitted to exhibit in any Department in which he judges.

No Trailer, camper, tent or other accommodations may be hooked up to any barn. Designat ed areas have been provided for these. Check at the SECRETARY'S OFFICE for a TRAILER/ CAMPER SPACE PERMIT. NO VEHICLE MAY BE PARKED WITHIN FIFTY (50) FEET OF ANY BARN (FIRE REGULATION).

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits.

All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

2. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request.

CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.

3.All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.

- 4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
- 5. CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
- CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
- 7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's

Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the

Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. New examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit.

The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.

9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animals(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited.

Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds. 10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

IDENTIFICATION - Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate. ILLINOIS CATTLE -

Brucellosis: Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle. Tuberculosis: Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE -

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- 1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
 - C. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified)
 - D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
- 2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition. Tuberculosis:
- 1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
- 2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within

30 days prior to exhibition.

C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

ILLINOIS SWINE -

IDENTIFICATION – 1. Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch. 2. Ear notch identification is acceptable for barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine.

(Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)

Brucellosis: 1. Brucellosis is not required for Illinois swine.

Pseudorabies: Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

OUT-OF-STATE SWINE -

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

IDENTIFICATION - 1. Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch. 2. Ear notch identification is not acceptable for crossbred animals.

Brucellosis:

- 1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
- 2. Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

Pseudorabies:

- 1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
- 2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
- 3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
- 4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP AND GOATS

IDENTIFICATION - Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo, official metal or plastic tag. A micro chip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used. MARKET LAMBS -

All wethers must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified. ILLINOIS SHEEP AND GOATS -

- 1. Sheep/Goats from a flock/herd with a laboratory diagnosis of scrapie are not permitted to exhibit unless they have been in the Voluntary Scrapie Flock Certification Program for at least three (3) years.
- 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock or origin, if different. OUT-OF-STATE SHEEP AND GOATS-

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- 1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.
- 3. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
- 4. Tuberculosis- Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

ILLINOIS EQUINE - 1. All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.

- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- 3. An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
- 4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.
- OUT-OF-STATE EQUINE All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php 1. All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit.
- 2. All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- 3. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- 4. All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

- All drivers must be 16 years old and have a valid driver's license. A driver under the age of 18 must have a parent or legal guardian sign waiver. Notary will be present to verify.
- Truck pull tech. personnel may inspect the truck and driver at any time. No adjustments may be made to the truck after check in, and hitch height checks are complete.
- Once the sled is ready for competition, all pullers must promptly get on track and hooked up for their turn.
- In the event of a pull-off, trucks will pull in the same order as they originally pulled and have only one attempt to move sled. If you cannot make the call for your turn in the pull-off, you will finish in the lowest position in the pull-off.
- Any truck or part of the sled that goes out of bounds under the green flag will be disqualified (side flaps of sled excluded). This does not pertain to test puller or if puller has attempted to stop before the 100' mark.
- A pull is considered over once the sled passes the 300' mark, or designated full pull mark, (when red flag is waived). Unless the class is using a floating finish.





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
